<b>Are hard hats maintained correctly:</b>				
Is the shell replaced if it is broken, punctured, cracked, or split				
Are hats replaced if they have received a heavy blow, even if damage isn't visible				
Are headbands replaced if they are stretched or worn				
Are employees told not to drill ventilation holes in hard hats				
Are headbands washed regularly				
Are hard hats washed periodically in hot soapy water				
Are employees told not to toss hats around				
Are employees told to keep hats out of direct sun or high heat
